

William Shakespeare: Julius Caesar (Drama) - Activity Plan

Length of Activity: 60 min.

Lesson Summary:

Students will understand the events happening in the first Act of the play “Julius Caesar”. They will analyze the personality traits of characters appearing in the first part of the play and relate them with real people found in the society. They will understand the significance of the opening scene of the play and how it foreshadows the future actions in the play.

Lesson Objectives:

After the completion of the lesson, the students will be able to:

- Describe William Shakespeare’s life and achievements as a dramatist.
- Summarize the events that take place in the first Act of the play “Julius Caesar”.
- Sketch the characters that appear in the first Act of the play “Julius Caesar”.
- Give their impressions of various characters introduced in the first Act of the play.
- Explain the dramatic significance of the opening scene of the play.
- Relate the incidents happening in the play to real-life situation.

Intended Curriculum Learning Outcomes

- Students will learn the skills of listening, speaking, reading and writing.
- Student will have the opportunity to learn through group work, role play, activities, participating and sharing and the constructive use of technology.
- Student will relate the incidents happening in the play to real-life situation.
- Student will learn the judgmental skills required to analyze the situation and personality traits.

Instructional Activities

- Teacher will motivate the students by showing the video clip of the play “Julius Caesar” and ask some questions to test comprehension. (5 min)
- Teacher will then read the text and interpret the lines with questions to the students occasionally to ensure interaction. (15 minutes)
- Teacher asks the students to **work in groups** and **collect articles** related to play from the Internet sources.
- Teacher asks the students to perform a **Role Play** and assume characters that appear in the first Act of the play.
- Teacher arranges a ‘**Pick & Speak Activity**’.

- Teacher asks the students to involve in a ‘Think-pair-share (TPS)’, a **collaborative learning activity** and relate the incidents happening in the play to real-life situation.

Respond

- Summarise the first scene of the play in their own words. (cognitive level: understand)
- Explain the dramatic significance of the opening scene of the play. (cognitive level: understand)
- State your impression of the major characters appearing in Scene I of Act I. . (cognitive level: analyse)
